

Other Classes Offered by Joshua Reish

1. Research Paper

This class will teach the full length MLA style research paper of fifteen to twenty pages with at least eight sources. Peer editing techniques will be taught and utilized as well as heavy editing by the teacher.

2. Jr. High Composition

This class will utilize Training for Triumph's curriculum Meaningful Composition. During the course students will write 6-8 original essays of different types. Grammar will be taught within the context of writing.

3. High School Composition

This class will utilize Training for Triumph's curriculum Meaningful Composition. During the course students will write 6-8 original essays of different types. Grammar will be taught within the context of writing. Students will also be introduced to the writing portion of the SAT.

4. Elementary and Middle School Speech

This is a gentle introduction to speech. Students will learn outlining techniques, several types of speeches, dramatics skills and more. Games, activities, and fun speeches will be used to teach basic communication skills in the class.

5. High School Speech and Debate

This class introduces speech techniques. Students will learn how to write a speech, physical delivery, and vocal delivery as well as the basics of debate will also be covered.

6. Literary Analysis This class examines three classic literary works. Students are taught how to analyze the various aspects of the work and recognize various literary techniques

7. Story Writing

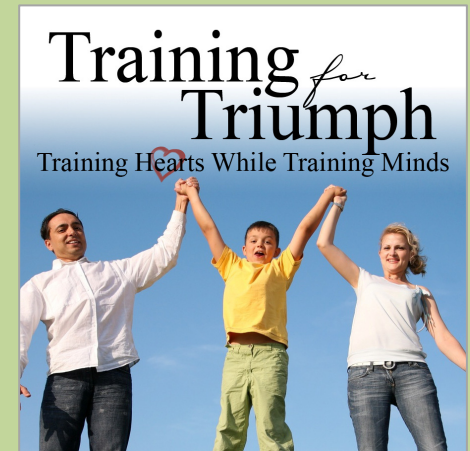

3 hour 16 Week Class

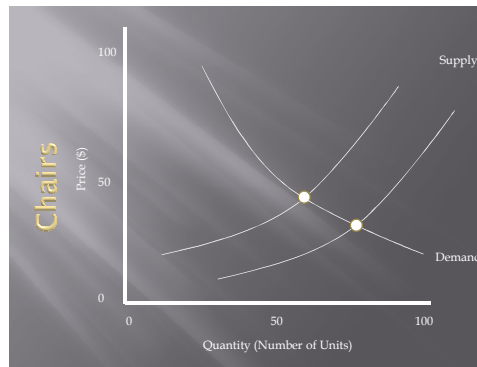
